

UCLA COSMOS – Residential Assistant

Program Description: The California State Summer School for Mathematics & Science (COSMOS) program at UCLA is a four-week summer residential program for high school students who have demonstrated an aptitude for academic and professional careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) subjects. Students participate in one of the topic specific cluster areas taught by the UCLA faculty. The academic and residential components of the COSMOS program offer these students a first glance at the college experience. COSMOS fosters its students' interests, skills, and awareness of educational and career options in STEM fields through challenging curricula that are both hands-on and lab-intensive.

Position Description: Residential Assistants (RAs) work as part of the Residential Staff for COSMOS, primarily covering evenings and weekends. They are responsible for, but not limited to, supervision of high school students, attendance at all recreational outings, programming nightly activities, policy enforcement, conflict mediation, overall safety and security of students, and assistance with crisis management and emergency response. RAs generally work every night (except one weeknight) 5:00 pm – 9:00 am, and all-day Saturdays. RAs are required to remain at the dorms overnight during on-call nights to respond to any student emergencies that may arise. RAs partner with a Teaching Instructors (TI) who are both assigned to one group of students (a cluster), for whom they will be the primary leaders. Both will also work for the program as a whole, supporting students from all clusters when needed. On-campus housing and meals will be provided for the duration of the program.

While there is no academic component for this position, best efforts will be made to place RAs with their preferred cluster. Descriptions for all this year's clusters can be found here.

Position Qualifications:

Required:

- UC Undergraduate student registered at least through Summer 2025 with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- CPR and First Aid certified prior to the start of the program dates
- Clear a pre-employment criminal background check
- Must be available to work during specified hours for all COSMOS summer program dates (and dates leading up to the program, including weekends: (July 6 - Aug 2, 2025* subject to change)
- Commitment to stay at dorms during overnight shifts
- Available during all on-call hours or on-call exceptions
- Able to complete the duties and responsibilities required of the position
- Flexibility to meet changing needs of the program

Preferred:

- Experience managing youth groups and/or prior experience working with children
- Ability to assess needs and concerns of high school students
- Ability to work effectively with diverse population of students and staff
- Excellent interpersonal skills and able to build positive rapport with other students
- Ability to lift up to 30 pounds

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Plan and lead nightly recreational activities
- Provide guidance and supervision to students ranging from ages 13-18
- Provide personal support to students
- Attend and supervise weekend outings
- Serve as a role model for appropriate conduct on a college campus
- Uphold program rules in the residence halls, on UCLA premises and scheduled field trips
- Coordinate all recreational activities
- Assist staff with disseminating and collecting all necessary paperwork and materials
- Attend residential staff meetings
- Facilitate morning/nightly announcements with students
- Prepare and submit paperwork (such as incident reports, activity logs, etc.)
- Ensure safety and welfare of students by enforcing rules and addressing conduct issues
- Take appropriate actions in emergency situations and contact appropriate people in the case of an emergency
- Complete any additional duties assigned during the program in a timely manner
- RAs are expected role model positive behavior and represent UCLA in accordance with the <u>True</u>
 <u>Bruin Values and the UCLA Principles of Community</u> even when not actively performing job
 functions.
